## 'Holiday in Wales' to defeat Covid urges health minister

The Health Minister, Eluned Morgan is encouraging people to holiday in Wales this summer, as the fight against the Covid-19 virus continues.

International travel for people in Vales restarted on Monday, May 17 and a traffic lights system, aligned with England and Scotland, is in place with countries, depending on their rates of Covid-19.

Mandatory quarantine is in-place for all people returning to the UK from countries on the am-ber and red lists. All people re-turning from overseas travel must have a PCR test. People travelling overseas must also follow the rules

f the countries they plan to visit. Health minister Eluned Morgan aid: "I know people are, looking brward to a holiday after the year we have all had, but this is the year o holiday at home and enjoy eve-ything Wales has to offer.

I would encourage people to apport local businesses in par-rular in the tourism and hospiity sector which have been hard

hit by the pandemic.

Travelling overseas is definitely not going to be the same as it was before the pandemic – everyone will need to take a test before they leave and when they return and some people will need to quaran-

ine on their return to the UK." She added: "We've all worked re ally hard to bring coronavirus un-der control in Wales; we need to do over control in wates, we need to do
everything we can to prevent coronavirus from being re-imported
into Wales from travel. Our strong
advice to the public is to only travel overseas if it is essential.

nation for urgent international travel, which allows them to prove they have received both doses of a

Covid-19 vaccine. People living in Wales can re-

quest a certificate only if:

They have had both doses of the Covid-19 vaccine (they should wait five days after their second dose efore requesting it)

 They urgently need to travel to a country which requires vaccine certification

• They are not able to either quarantine or provide tests to meet country entry requirements.

People can call 0300 303 5667 to re-quest a vaccination certificate for urgent international travel only. The minister added: "We have

for those who need to travel ur-gently. There is only a very limited number of countries you can trav-el to without quarantining and not many countries currently ask for vaccine status as proof to travel.

"If you really have to travel, please check if your destination requires proof of vaccination. A certificate will take seven to ten working days to arrive so please also also also also are ask." plan ahead but again we are ask-ing everyone to please think care-fully about travelling overseas." ing with the UK Government to enable citizens to use the NHS App to show their vaccination status.

A "paper-based vaccination status" is now available for people in Wales who have had two doses of vaccination and need to urgently travel to a country that requires proof of vaccination.

The Welsh government said residents must consult the requirements for visitors for any country they plan to travel to as restric-tions may be in place - including proof of vaccination, tests, quar-

proof of vaccination, tests, quar-antine and reasons for entry. First Minister Mark Drakeford said: Mr Drakeford said: "This is the year to take your holiday in Wales and foreign travel is best avoided." He has urged caution against "importing" coronavirus from other parts of the world.
